# BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE 2018

## Year 11 & 12



BYOD (Bring your Own Device) refers to students bringing a personally owned device to school for the purpose of learning. In 2018 Karratha SHS will be moving to this model for all Year 11 and 12 students. Karratha SHS recognises the need to prepare students for a rapidly changing world where technology plays an increasing role in students' everyday lives.

### What devices can student bring to school?

Students can bring laptops to school that meet the following specifications:

Windows based laptops running Windows 10 or Windows 10 Pro

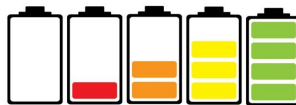


USB capability



Battery life – Devices must last at least 10 hours without charge.

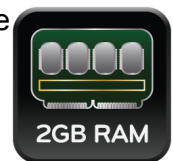
There will be no facilities to charge the device at school



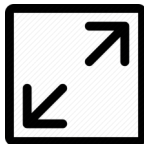
Wireless connectivity – Devices must support 5GHz dual band, 802.11 a/b/g/n wireless



Minimum of 128 GB storage and 2GB RAM



Screen size – must be at least 10 diagonal inches



### Software & Applications

Laptops must have installed:

- Windows 10 Operating Software

- Web Browser - Chrome, Firefox, Edge

Office 365 - Word, Excel, Powerpoint, Onenote

Active, up to date antivirus software

# General Information

Parents may choose to purchase a device from any source however only devices with the specifications outlined will be able to be used in the school.

## Student & Family Responsibility

- Sign the BYOD Student Agreement before bringing their devices to school
- Ensure their devices are safe and secure at all times
- Are responsible for lost, damaged or stolen devices

## Misuse of Laptop During School Hours

Internet access on the device will be filtered at school and students will be prohibited from connecting to other networks while at school. Students will comply with the Department of Education (DoE) and school policies concerning the use of BYODs at school and while connected to the DoE network.

## Technical Support

KSHS staff are under no obligation to provide any technical support on either hardware or software.

Long-term care and support of BYODs

- Students are solely responsible for repair and maintenance of their own device. It is not the school's responsibility.
- Warranties: Students should understand the limitations of the manufacturer's warranty on their BYOD, both in duration and in coverage. Under Australian consumer legislation, warranties usually last for one year. During this period any manufacturing defects will be repaired or the device will be replaced (as per the specific terms and conditions of the manufacturer).
- Extended warranties: At the time of purchase, students may also purchase an optional extended warranty (past the standard warranty period) from the supplier/manufacturer

## Insurance

Students are responsible for the care of the device while at school as they are their property. We suggest parents check with their insurance companies to check their level of cover. While some contents insurance packages automatically include devices away from home, others require additional cover.
