Student Improvement Targets 2021 – 2024

The progress of students from Year 7 to 9 in NAPLAN reading, writing and numeracy is greater than like-schools and the gap between Karratha SHS and WA public schools is reduced.

The percentage of students achieving at, or above Band 8 in Year 9 NAPLAN reading, writing and numeracy is greater than like-schools and the gap between Karratha SHS and WA public schools is reduced.

The percentage of students achieving 90% or above attendance, increases each year and the gap between Karratha SHS and WA public schools is reduced.

The Median ATAR to be maintained above like-schools and the gap between Karratha SHS and WA public schools is reduced.

Increase the percentage of Year 12 students meeting the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) standards.

The percentage of students with their WACE, is at or above like schools, and the gap between Karratha SHS and WA public schools is reduced.

Students on Special Education Needs (SEN) plans, achieve 50% or more of SEN goals each reporting cycle.

The National School Opinion Survey reflects positive satisfaction regarding safety, care and feeling valued.

The National School Opinion Survey demonstrates a positive upward trend in the rating of teachers as good teachers by students.

Karratha SHS is embarking on a whole school improvement program supported by our involvement in the Fogarty EDvance. This program continues to drive school planning and decision-making processes using valid, evidence based strategies and data. - Implement strategies to capture student voice and feedback





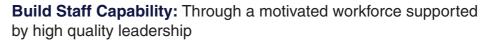
Conditions for Learning: Develop an inclusive learning environment to support student learning and engagement
